Tasks	 The Hands on History Volunteers are responsible for: Visitor Engagement in the Galleries To deliver the Hands on History carts. To develop skills in linking the objects in the Hands on History Carts with the story of the Army and other objects in the Galleries. Working in collaboration with the VE Team to assist visitors in the Galleries. To facilitate a safe working environment for the valuable objects. Administration To assist in the movement of the handling carts from storage to galleries. To work with the VE Team and Supervisor to facilitate activities. To monitor participant levels during sessions and events. To evaluate sessions and provide feedback to inform
	future developments.
